General Terms of Competition

March - 2026

The “General Terms of Competition” is Oak Royal Golf Clubs principle document defining the structure of our competitions and detailing: who may enter and how they do so; the format to be played and how ties are decided; when a scorecard is considered returned; how and in what circumstances the terms may be altered; Prize’s and prize fund allocation; Posting of results; and when the competition will be considered closed.

These “General Terms of Competition” have been compiled by the clubs Handicap and Competitions Committee in line with Committee Procedures included in the Official Guide to Rules of Golf, (Current members displayed in club shop) and will be updated annually if required.

The committee requires 3 to form a quorum.

Where there are specific terms relating to individual competitions, these will be documented and listed separately.

All competitions shall be played in accordance with the Rules of Golf as approved by R&A Rules Limited and Local Rules approved by the Committee.

To participate in any competition at Oak Royal Golf club, you must fully adhere to the “General Terms of Competition” as set out in this document, failure to do so will / may result in a disqualification and, or penalties being imposed by the handicap and competition committee.

On entering any competition at Oak Royal Golf Club you accept and acknowledge your full understanding and acceptance of the said competition rules and terms.

Eligibility –

- There are no gender or age restrictions
- You must be of “Amateur golfer” status
- You must be a member of Oak Royal Golf club (exceptions for any Club Open events)
- You must have recognised WHS handicap index
- You must have at least 12 scores recorded on the WHS platform to qualify for a prize.
- You must be a 7-day member, or be prepared to pay an additional green fee, to participate within the Saturday, and or Knockout competitions.
- All members are expected to keep fully up to date with changes in our local rules and the general rules of golf as per the England Golf Web site.

Entry Information / Requirements –

- All “individual” competitions will go live on BRS 14 days prior to taking place.
- Players need to book their own slot / Tee.
- “Drawn” competitions – All “Drawn” competitions will go live on BRS 14 days prior to taking place, they are available on a first come basis, the draw will normally take place at least 24hrs before the first Tee.
- Any required competition / entry fees must be paid prior to playing
- All players must “Sign In” to the competition, via the computers in the club shop, prior to commencing play.

General / Format –

- Closing Dates for Knock out rounds will be displayed on the Knockout sheet.
- For “Drawn” events Tee times will be allocated on a first out first tee time basis.
- Each individual competition will have its own format regarding type of play i.e. Stroke Play, Stableford, Matchplay, and for team events Scramble, Better ball etc, in which case there will be specific Terms relating to these competitions available, with a reminder posted in the shop on the day.
- Some competitions will have handicap restrictions in place, where applicable these will be detailed in the specific terms relating to the said competition, the restrictions will be based on strokes received NOT a WHS index.
- Playing handicap allowances will be set for each competition using WHS recommendations as a guide. i.e. 95% for standard stroke play.
- All Summer competition events will be played over 9 or 18 holes off White (men), and Red / Yellow (Ladies / Juniors) Tee sets.
- All 18-hole competitions will start on hole 1 and be played in numerical order finishing on hole 18
- All weekly 9-hole competitions be played in numerical order and will alternate between the front and back 9, the front 9 starting on hole 1 and finished on hole 9, the back 9 starting on hole 10 and finishing on hole 18. In Winter Yellow / Blues tees for the Men and Yellow/ Red for the ladies / Juniors.

Score cards -

- Must have the players, and the markers name clearly printed at the top.
- Must have both the players and the markers signatures on the bottom.
- Must be clearly completed and legible.
- Must contain the correct date and name of the competition
- Must be completed while still on the course or in the club shop, (NOT in the bar)
- It is the players responsibility to ensure his / her scores are correct and entered onto the computer prior to the card being put into the card box.
- Once the scores are entered and the card posted, it is deemed that the score card has been officially returned.
- Completed cards must be returned within a reasonable time after completion of the round, in any case within a maximum of 30 minutes.

Ties -

- Matchplay - (Knockouts only) the match is extended one hole at a time, without any extra handicap allowance, until there is a clear winner.
- Stroke play competitions (*all formats, excluding board competitions see below*) winners based on a card count back, (Net Score)
- For an 18-hole competition it is as follows: Best score for the last 9 holes, then the last 6 holes, then the last 3 holes, and finally, the last hole. If there is still a tie, then the tie should be determined based on the last 6 holes of the first 9 holes, then the last 3 holes of the first 9 holes, and then the last hole of the first 9 holes.
- For a 9-hole competition it is as follows: best score on the last 6 holes, then the last 3 holes, and then the last hole.
- If after all the count backs, there is not a clear winner then the competition will be deemed as being drawn and the prizes allocated accordingly.
- “Board competitions” (see separate listings) in case of a tie then contending players will be asked to play holes 1 to 4 with no extra handicap allowance, with the lowest overall score winning, if there is still no clear winner, the match continues, with any remaining players that are in ties, over holes 5 to 18 on a sudden death basis until a lowest score on a hole is returned to determine the winner. If this cannot be played on the day, then it can be played after the following Saturdays competition.

Final / Posting Results

- Individual competitions are deemed closed and the results as final once the information is available via the “Howdidido” platform.
- For Knock outs, it is when the finalists have played their match.
- For any team events the results will be calculated within a reasonable time after completion of the competition and posted on our various What’s App pages as well as being displayed in the club shop.
- Most competition results will be displayed on our What’s App pages as well as displayed within the shop.
- However, for all competitions, the club reserve the right to review any scores / winners from any previous competitions, should a valid reason to do so be brought to their attention, but only if the valid reason is received within 48 hours of the competition results being posted.
- Any objection, or genuine reason why a competition result should be queried must be submitted, in writing, to the club within 48hrs of the result being posted.

Prizes –

- Prizes allocated to the different competitions are determined by the Handicap and Competitions committee prior to the start of the season and are displayed on the notice board in the shop.
- Prizes will be issued at the end of the month, in line with official guidelines there is NO cash alternative, winners will be asked to select their choice of prize on a sheet that is displayed in the club shop.
- All prizes won and issued for competitions played at Oak Royal Golf club shall be paid in the form of monetary credits for a small pre-selected range of Club / golfing outlets. In accordance with amateur golfing rules there will no cash alternatives / payments
- Twos, if a Twos “Pot” is being run alongside a Club competition, then anyone who scores a hole in one will automatically win 50% of any pot, assuming another Two was also scored, if not they get 100%.

Bad Weather –

- In the case where bad weather causes the cancellation of a competition the club reserves the right to reschedule, if they feel it is applicable.
- If there is a premature closure of a competition due to bad weather, where less than 25% of the field have completed the competition then it will be deemed as null and void. If more than 75% of the field have completed the competition, then normal results will be posted, but in either case there are no OOM points issued. For those who don’t play, or if it gets cancelled receive a full refund, Twos carry over.

Miscellaneous -

- Missed Tee times (by more than 5 minutes) will lead to a disqualification unless there is a communication to the club stating a reasonable explanation which is accepted by a committee member, whereafter a new tee time will be allocated if available.
- You CANNOT cancel and rebook a later or earlier tee time on a competition day without a valid reason that has been accepted, and agreed by a committee member, in all other cases it will lead to a disqualification.
- If you fail to meet a booked Tee time, withdraw without, or with very short notice (under 48 hours), on more than one occasion, you will incur sanctions from the club, these are likely to be in the form of time restricted access to competitions, in these situations there will be direct communication from the club to the offending player setting out the details.
- Powered ride on buggies may only be used within competitions on production of an up-to-date medical certificate, or by approval of the handicap and competition committee. Failure to comply will lead to a disqualification.
- In participating in a club competition, you automatically accept that you have a duty to report, to a committee member, any “rule infringements” you may see being made by other competition participants.
- Any, and all handicap restrictions imposed in any said competition or division apply equally to both all the men and ladies participating.
- Any competition handicap restrictions introduced or imposed for Juniors will be calculated and communicated prior to the commencement of play.
- The club and or Handicap and Competitions Committee reserve the right to change, update, or modify these terms without notice should it be felt to be required, however should that be the case then these alterations would be circulated to the members within a reasonable time frame.

Board Competitions – *(Handicap restrictions (28) and play off terms are in place)
these are also qualifiers (winners only) for the Summer Saturday OOM final)*

Formats of Play – Detail.

Stroke Play or Medal

A stroke play game over a predetermined number of holes normally 9 or 18.

- Each player MUST hole out at every hole
- The total number of shots (for each individual player) taken over the round is added together to give an individual gross score.
- The net score is derived by taking the players strokes received off the gross score.

Stableford

- A stroke play game over a predetermined number of holes normally 9 or 18
- Points awarded against the players net score on each hole taking into consideration strokes received and hole index.
- Points awarded as follows
 - Net score more than one over par for the hole 0 points
 - Net score one over par for the hole 1 point
 - Net score equal to par for the hole 2 points
 - Net score one below par for the hole 3 points
 - Net Score Two below par for the hole 4 pointsAnd so on....
- When a player is unable to score any points on a particular hole, they may pick up their ball, without penalty, and proceed to the next hole, this practice is encouraged to assist in the pace of play.

Match Play - Singles

- Two Players compete against each other over a predetermined number of holes normally 9 or 18.
- The player who holes their ball in the fewest shots wins the hole, in a handicap match the lowest NET score wins the hole. Holes are halved if the net scores are equal,
- The reckoning of the match is kept by the terms: “Holes Up”, “Holes Down”, or “all square”
- The player who wins the greatest number of holes is the winner, or if a player is more holes up than are remaining to play, then they are the winner.
- In a handicap match play competition, the strokes received by the higher handicap player is the difference between their handicap and the strokes received by the lower handicap player, who then plays off scratch. i.e Player “A” has 19 strokes received over 18 holes, Player “B” has 11 strokes received over 18 holes, therefore Player “A” would receive 8 strokes over the 18 holes, and player “B” zero.

Match Play – 4 Balls

- Two players play as a team and compete against another team of two players over a predetermined number of holes normally 9 or 18.
- The player who holes their ball in the fewest shots wins the hole, in a handicap match the lowest NET score wins the hole. Holes are halved if the net scores are equal,
- The reckoning of the match is kept by the terms: “Holes Up”, “Holes Down”, or “all square”
- The “Team” who wins the greatest number of holes is the winner, or if a “Team” is more holes up than are remaining to play, then they are the winner.

In a handicap match play competition, the strokes received by the higher handicap player is the difference between their handicap and the strokes received by the lowest handicap player, who then plays off scratch. i.e. Player “A” has 19 strokes received over 18 holes, Player “B” has 11 strokes received over 18 holes, Player “C” has 15 Strokes received and Player “D” has 6 Strokes received Therefore Player “A” would receive 13 strokes, Player “B” would receive 5 Strokes, Player “C” would receive 9 Strokes and Player “D” would play off Scratch.

Foursomes

- A game where two players play as a team, use one ball and play alternate shots
- They must take alternate drives therefore one player always driving on odd holes, and the other on even holes.
- This format can be played for stroke play, Stableford or match play events.
- Handicaps calculated by adding players handicap index together and dividing by 2 then using slope rating boards

Greensomes

- A game where two players play as a team,
- Both players drive off, then choose which drive to take.
- The player who picked up their ball, after the drive, is the player who takes the first shot with the remaining ball.
- They then play by taking alternative shots until the ball is holed.
- This format can be played for stroke play, Stableford or match play events.
- Handicap allowance 60% of the lower playing handicap and 40% of the higher playing handicap and add together. Round up to nearest handicap >0.5 and round down <0.5 to nearest full number.

Texas Scramble

Normally played in teams of three or four players over 18 holes

- Each player drives and one drive is selected, this ball is marked, and all the other players then play their 2nd shot from within 6 inches of the “marked” ball. This process is repeated until the balls are holed out.
- Once a ball is holed out the score with that ball counts for the score for that hole.
- Each player must have at least 5 drives selected in a 3-man team and 4 selected in a 4-man team.
- Handicap allowances 30% of lowest/ 20% of 2nd lowest and 10% of highest and add together.

Four Ball Better Ball (Stableford)

- A game where two players play as team against another team of two players, normally over 18 holes.
- Both players play each hole with their own ball
- The best score, per team, on that hole is the one recorded for that team
- The winning team is the team with the most points accumulated over the holes played
- 85% individual handicap allowance

Yellow Ball (Stableford)

- This is a 3-man team event normally played over 9 or 18 holes.
- The designated “Yellow” ball is played by one player on each hole, and any points scored while playing the “Yellow” ball are counted as double.
- If the “Yellow” ball is lost or knocked out of bounds then the player who is playing it plays a 2nd ball, under normal rules and penalties, however, should they still score on that hole the score is NOT doubled.
- Each player plays the “Yellow” ball in turn, i.e Player 1= 1,4,7, player 2 = 2,5,8 etc
- The scoring format is Stableford (scoring already covered off previously) where the “Yellow” ball score is added to the highest other score gained on that hole, therefore should the “Yellow” ball fail to score then it would 0 + the highest other score.
- 90% individual handicap allowance

Three clubs and a Putter

An individual Stableford game (*scoring already covered off above*) played over the longest nine holes, off white tees.

- You may only have 4 clubs in your bag and one of those must be a putter.
- Normal golfing rules apply
- Full Handicap allowance

Golfer None Golfer – Fun Event

- A two-player team event, where a golfer plays with a nongolfer over 9 holes.
- Played off **YELLOW TEES**
- The scoring format is normal stroke play (*scoring already covered off above*). however total Putts are also counted separately
- The golfer Tees off and plays their ball until it is on the Green, whereafter they must stand off the Green and without verbal or any other assistance, allow the nongolfer to putt the ball into the hole.
- If the nongolfer plays the ball off the green, while trying to get it into the hole, the Golfer may knock it back on. Whereafter the nongolfer Putts again until the ball is in the hole.
- If a Golfer “Chips in” then putts recorded on that hole would equal Zero
- Full Handicap allowance
- A non-Golfer is as it says **someone who has previously not played golf**, however previously playing this fun competition does not count.

Past Captains

- A four person Team event played over 18 holes
- Scoring is based around the Stableford format
- Best Two scores count on each hole
- All scores count on Par 3's
- Normal Golf rules apply
- Full Handicaps allowance

Order of Merit

- A season long individual competition founded on points received, based on where you finished in any given qualifying round,
- The qualifying period is posted before the start of a new summer season, for both the upcoming summer season and the following winter season, applicable to both the Saturday and Wednesday competitions.
- Points are allocated per finishing position - 1st = 20 points, going down to 1 point for 20th.
- Individual weekly qualifying points are added up, separately for Wednesday and Saturday, over the winter or summer seasons producing "OOM league tables"
- For the summer and winter leagues, prizes will be issued to the TOP 10 places, (values depending on funds) for the Wednesday League the minimum will be Top 10 but may be extended dependent of funds received.
- In the event of a tie for 1st place, the player with the least overall rounds played over the season will be declared the winner, for other ties there will be equal positions and prizes accordingly.
- In the event of Divisions being played on a Wednesday (Summer only) then there will no order of merit points or calculations.

Order of Merit final

- An Individual competition, played over 18 holes – Stroke Play event.
- 21 places available for the final.
- Players qualify to play via their finishing position within the OOM league table, or by winning a qualifying board competition.
- If players in the Top 20 who have qualified cannot play, then players outside the top 20 will be invited, (highest finishers first) until the competition is full.
- The previous year's winner, even if not in the top 20, may also defend their title
- 95% handicap allowance

Most Improved Golfer

- A season long individual competition founded on improvements made to the individuals WHS handicap index, based on where they started to where they finished.
- The person who has the greatest reduction, calculated as a percentage, is determined the winner
- The qualifying period is posted before the start of a new summer season, and to qualify for entrance, you must have been an Oak Royal Club member for 12 months or over, and have had a full WHS handicap, again for 12 months or over.

Miscellaneous

- Longest Drives, nearest the Pin, and nearest the centre of the fairway, can only be won with your original ball for that hole, e.g. they cannot therefore be won if you are playing 3 off the tee, having gone out of bounds etc.
- Longest drives and nearest centre must clearly be on the fairway and nearest the pin on the green. Putting and chipping competitions (on Captains Day) Captain to set local rules on the day.

Divisions (Wednesday Summer)

- At the club's discretion handicap divisions may be introduced for Summer Wednesday competitions.
- If applicable, there will two divisions, these being based on shots received after using the appropriate slope rating tables and the players handicap index.
- Division 1 will be for Players with 0 to 18 shots received over 18 holes, therefore allowing up to a maximum of 9 shots (before reducing to 95%) over 9 holes.
- Division 2 will be for Players with 19 or more shots received over 18 holes, with a maximum allowed of 36 shots, therefore allowing up to a maximum of 18 shots (before reducing to 95%) over 9 holes.
- Players will move between divisions as and when dictated by their playing handicap index.
- There will only be prizes allocated to 1st & 2nd finishing positions for each division.

While every care has been taken to produce these "Terms of Competition" the club realises that it cannot possibly cover every possible scenario that may come in to play through the completion of numerous competitions via hundreds of individual rounds and players. Therefore, should a situation arise that is not covered within these "Terms" then it should, in the first instance, be referred to the clubs Handicap and Competition Committee in writing (email with suffice) within 48 hours of the said scenario, whereupon the committee will endeavour to resolve the issue and if required update the "Terms" accordingly.
